Sligo's Top Ten Sports Stars, 1969, are:

CLAIRE WALSH (Athletics): Her most outstanding achievement of the year was victory in the 100 m., 200 m., and 400 m. in the All-Ireland Championships held in Santry Stadium in July.

MICHAEL FLEMING (Badminton): Selected by Sligo's sports writers for his outstanding contribution to badminton in the area through the years. He was on the Sligo team which won the Ali-Ireland Championship by defeating Wexford in Dublin in April.

JOHN McGOWAN (Basketball): Despite a series of injuries early in the season, he recovered completely and was selected as reserve on the Irish International Senior Basketball team. Last week he was star performer in the inter-provincial series.

LIAM CAFFREY (Gaelic LIAM CAFFREY (Gaelic Football): Long overshadowed by Mickey Kearins, Liam Caffrey has given outstanding service to the County Sligo team. His selection on successive Connaught teams, together with his brilliant performance against Kildare in the National League semi-final, earned him the award.

MICK BURKE (Hurling): Dedicated to the promotion of in the county, his work behind the scenes is contributing greatly to a revival of interest in hurling in Sligo. He was selected on the Connaught hurling team last year and performed well in the Railway Cup.

GEORGE DRAPER (Rugby): Selected last year to captain the Connaught team for an inter-provincial game against Ulster in

KEN TURNER (Soccer): Appointed player-coach of Sligo Rovers, he has succeeded in shaping a bright future for Sligo in the F.A.I. Cup and has improved considerably their fortunes in the League of Ireland.

MARTIN O'HARA (Cycling): One of Sligo's most promising young cyclists he won three prizes in last year's Ras Tailtean and then went on to take three prizes in the Ras Connachta.

PATSY LANG (Swimming): She was a member of the Ursuline Convent team which won the vent team which won the All-Ireland Life-saving Championship in Dublin last October for the third

year in succession. DONAL NEARY (Wrestling): Last year he became the first Sligoman ever to win an Irish Senior Wrest-ling title by taking the bantam-
