DONCASTER — This team are coming to Ireland for the first time and are expecting to do well. They have several English Internationals in their squad. A tall team with excellent outside shooters Doncaster are crowd favourites wherever they play.

UNIVERSITY OF MAINZ (Germany) — This is a surprise team for the tournament. Participants in the German Federal League this team looks like a real power house. Recent tournaments proved that European basketball teams can be extremely tough. An honour to have this distinguished team in Dublin.

SITE ONE SONICS — This all American-Scottish based team believe they can win the tournament. Losing to Borroughmuir by only one point recently they showed the kind of a force they will be.
